
He was killed on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1917 at the age of 27.






No great battles were being fought in this area at the time. The 56<sup>th</sup> Company was later involved in the Third battle of Ypres which started on 31<sup>st</sup> July 1917.

George is buried at Klein Vierstraat Cemetery, Plot 1, south west of Ypres.

George's medal record shows him first as Private in the Hampshire Regiment, rising to Corporal and at his death he was serving with the 56th Company Machine Gun Corps. He was awarded the Victory and British Medals and 14 Star.
